

- In 2014-2015, students in grades 6-8 will receive a minimum of 28 instructional periods focused on college and career readiness.

Result

- Ongoing experiences:
 - 9th grade -- field trip to RCTC
 - 10th grade -- College Planning Groups, PLAN Test
 - 11th Grade -- Careers Class, 11th Grade Trip to Minnesota Education Fair, ACT Test, Practice ACT
 - 12th Grade -- Classroom presentations on college application process
 - all grades -- College admissions counselors visiting Pine Island High School, access to College and Career Center, Individual College and Career planning with counselor, and Mayo Health Care Career Festival
- Students in grades 6-8 received a minimum of 28 college and career readiness lessons.
